Welcome to the 18th edition of *The Transformer* - an update from the Smart Transformation Project. Smart Transformation works to future-proof the communities of Dysart and Moranbah, as we face rapid technological changes being experienced globally, and build the sustainability of our towns.

Smart Transformation operates independently, with support from BHP Mitsubishi Alliance (BMA), and is driven by the two towns' Smart Transformation Advisory Councils (STACs) and Youth Advisory Council (YAC). Council members capture feedback and advice from the communities they call home, to direct resources and effort into projects important to local residents.

## YAC 2024 identifies community issues





YAC members identified their main priorities for community sustainability for Smart Transformation. Priorities to help drive the sustainability of Dysart and Moranbah have been classified by members of Smart Transformation's 2024 Youth Advisory Council (YAC).

Coming together in Dysart for their first meeting of the year, the students were welcomed to Smart Transformation and congratulated on their selection to the 2024 YAC by facilitator Mitch Innes.

"We will give you information on the future of work, the skills you will need and how to access the new opportunities available," Mitch told the group.

"What we want from you is a youth voice into Smart Transformation – we want what you know to drive our priorities and our focus."

YAC members rated key challenges for their communities, with Childcare and Housing ranked the highest by the group. Innovative Futures – project supporting the investigation of economic development opportunities – was the

## 2024 - The Year of the Volunteer

# STAC Profile – Ash Dowd

Ash Dowd is a familiar face as General Manager of the Moranbah Workers Club, but he's also a tireless campaigner for his community.

A STAC member since Smart Transformation's inception in 2019, Ash wants to see his town grow and flourish as technologies change.

"My role is helping our town really move forward with technology, to make sure we're not missing out. We need to keep up with the Fourth Industrial Revolution and grow with it," Ash said.

Ash describes his years on the Moranbah STAC as "productive and satisfying" because he enjoys the opportunity to have a say and make a contribution to his community's future.

"We have such a great range of community people involved with the STACs, from business, education, medical – it's great that we can all come together and have important conversations about what our town needs to thrive.

"Bringing 5G into our region as quickly as we have has been the biggest achievement for me, but the job's not done."

Increasing the town's female population by encouraging more young families to move to Moranbah is now a key focus for Ash, and one that he believes will cement the town's long-term future.

"To bring in that higher female population, we need to fix childcare and we need better housing.

"It's time to sort childcare and housing to make sure we can really grow our town."
